



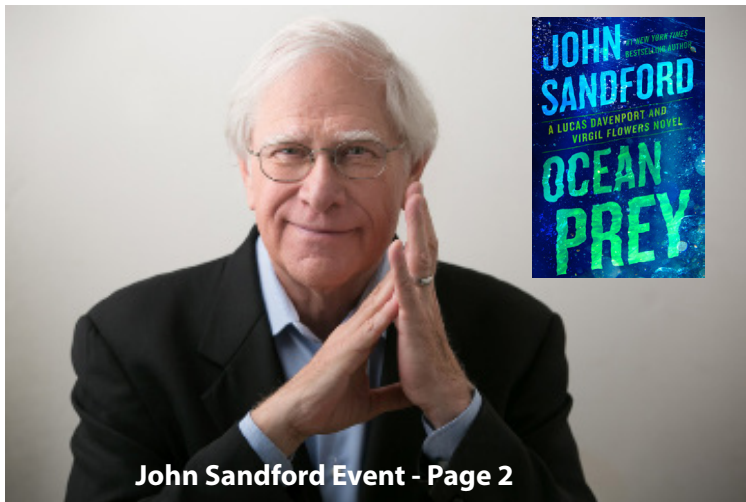

Curbside Pickup

Once library staff has your requested items in hand, we will contact you through your preferred method (text, email, phone call) and schedule a time for you to come pick the items up. We will walk you through the process when we schedule the appointment. Once you arrive for your appointment, pull up to the make-shift stop sign by the front doors and staff will bring your items out to you. You may be asked to show either your library card or photo id in order to make sure that we are giving the materials to the right person.

Renovating for the Future

As regular library users are well aware, the chandeliers in the adult services wing have never provided adequate lighting for nighttime library users. Additionally, the library's computer network is long past due for updating, and the current layout of the computer lab does not allow for social distancing, which is unacceptable in a pandemic. For all these reasons we decided that with the library closed to the public, it's the right time to resolve these issues. When we reopen, everyone will find much improved lighting and Wi-Fi, a new area for computers, and seating spread throughout the adult services area.

The Changing World of Library Services

On behalf of the staff and Board of Trustees of the Library, we would like to thank the residents of the library district for their patience as we strive to create alternative ways of providing services and delivering programs.

The members of the staff who were called back to work last spring all agreed to the concept that if we can't keep the staff healthy, we can't keep the public safe. The previous year's staff has been reduced by 50% and 50% of those members work from home several days a week to limit the number of people in the building at one time.

Those working in the building provide a curbside service for the checkout requests along with snack boxes

provided by the Greater Chicago Food Depository, requested printouts, craft kits, and any other items we can provide in this manner. Individuals who need a notary, passport registration, photocopies, computer printouts, and faxing can arrange appointments to come into the lobby and be assisted by staff.

The staff that work from home on our digital library services and programming also man the phones, emails, and reference services in-house on a rotating basis.

The library will continue to provide the optimum amount of services allowed within the restrictions handed to us by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Snacks for Kids and Teens Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays 2 - 4 pm

Free boxed snacks are available for youth and teens ages 18 and younger, and are available on a first-come, first-served basis while supplies last. Call the library for more information. Snack boxes are provided through a partnership with the Greater Chicago Food Depository.

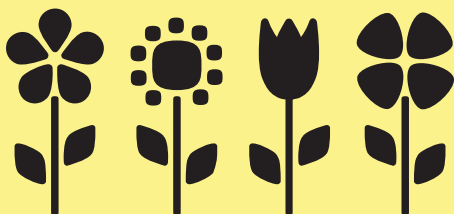

Brainfuse HelpNow

What is HelpNow?

It is free live one-on-one online tutoring from a Brainfuse tutor. Live tutoring is available in math, science, writing, and other subjects for elementary, middle school, high school, and college students everyday from 1 - 10 PM. All Brainfuse tutors have at least a four year degree and are background-checked.

HelpNow also includes live online help for Spanish language users and help from Spanish speaking tutors. There is also a writing lab that gives feedback on written assignments within 24 hours and much more.

With HelpNow, tutors and students communicate in real time in an online classroom by typing, drawing, and marking-up lessons and web content. Plus, students can use HelpNow's secure file sharing feature in the writing lab to submit writing assignments to writing tutors any time of the day.
